



Rooted deep in Southern Louisiana, you will find an array of things: the smell of Cajun cuisine, the accents of those around you, and some good 'ole hospitality. What's more: the Romeros - a family who has spent decades raising Charolais, advancing the mission of the AIJCA, and making friends with breeders across the Nation.

The Romero's Charolais Herd started after Craig and Pamela were married in 1984. While Craig grew up raising Charolais and Pamela grew up raising Angus, the two decided the breed of cattle was not most important; rather, it was the lessons their children would learn in the cattle industry that ultimately mattered. Together, they chose the Charolais breed and never looked back.

After being involved in the breed on the production scale, they chose to get their children involved in showing cattle. This decision would become a family passion that has taken them to many places and helped them make many friends. Their children - Nicholas, Hannah, Jacob, Sarah, Bethany, Danielle, and Isaac - were involved in many ways, from attending and competing in shows to helping with daily chores.

After traveling to the local shows for a few years, the family decided to attend their first AIJCA Junior National in Kearney, Nebraska in 1996.

"I remember thinking 'we may not know what we are doing,'" Pamela chuckled. "We never missed a Junior National after that and continued improving."

As their children reached their teenage years, the family recognized the many opportunities their peers did not enjoy by being involved within the Charolais industry. Hannah and Sarah both took their AIJCA experience to the next level by serving the membership and being elected to the Junior Board.

"AIJCA did more for our children growing up than any of the sports, clubs, or other school activities that they were involved in," Craig said.

The Romeros quickly became known for a variety of Junior National memories including their pit for cooking their Cajun spice for all attendees, the ruckus the boys caused, and the distractions by the Barbies (as referenced by Craig and Pamela.)

Reflecting on those memories brought forgotten ones to the forefront.

Since the children never showed at the same time, they never could make a full team for the fitting contest. So Isaac would take it upon himself to find other teams to join, of which Isaac was always the only out-of-state member.

When one of those teams won, Isaac was asked: "Why did they let you join their team and not let another person from their state on?" He immediately replied, "Because they know I'm good."

With the Romeros located in Louisiana, Junior Nationals meant road trips every summer. And with seven children and a trailer full of cattle, those trips were no easy task - especially since there were no other Louisiana families to help lighten the load. So it became customary for the girls to fly and the boys to make the long haul with the cattle, which always prompted the boys to comment: "How nice it must be to show up and have all the hard work done."

"On the way to the 2009 Junior National in Sacramento, we made sure to check over every part of our truck and trailer knowing it would be a long haul. Not too far outside of Tulsa, we noticed one of our back tires rolling past us. We forgot to put the lug nuts back on," Craig laughed.

The Romero children were known to bring bags to extend their vacations to other families' Charolais operations, connecting them with other breeders across the nation. They would come home with new friends and different perspectives on beef production throughout the United States.

The family achieved much success in the showing, but the most memorable was Hannah winning 2001-2002 AICA Show Heifer of the Year with Paynes Loretta 3L during her last year as a junior member.

Describing the organization as their family away from family, Craig and Pamela said: "The AIJCA did more for our children than we ever could. The AIJCA connected everyone in a way that there aren't any words for." The AIJCA membership felt the same and awarded the Romero family as the AIJCA Family of the Year in 2010.


"The association represents the way we wanted to raise our children. There's structure. You're not always going to win everything, so you need to know how to lose as gracefully as you learn how to win. You get along with everyone and it feels like family," Craig stated.

In 2018, the Romeros experienced a life-changing event when Isaac died in an automotive accident. They are grateful that Isaac left a positive impact on those he encountered - especially all the AIJCA members he touched with his hard work, generosity, and hospitality.

The Romeros are looking forward to the next generation of Charolais juniors in the show ring and continuing Isaac's legacy. With many of their grandchildren attending the 2021 AIJCA Junior National in Perry, it is only the beginning.

Other fond memories involved baby powder flying everywhere and barn antics that had given the boys their reputation of stirring the crowd.

Isaac would bring a plastic spider on a string and dangle on those that walked below, causing screams throughout the barns. And while at the 2005 Junior National in Kansas, a water balloon fight broke out so massive that no one in the barn was safe from becoming a target.

This year's show dedicatee is the definition of giving and passion for the Charolais industry. Whether it is lending a helping hand to someone in his community or offering children the opportunity to show their first 4-H or FFA project, he has always been there. Silas Maxwell's involvement in the cattle industry and the Charolais breed has been second to none in Tennessee and he does not plan to stop being a part of it anytime soon.

Silas has been active within the cattle industry and specifically raised Charolais for over fifty years, complementing a lifetime of involvement in agriculture. Growing up in Tennessee, Silas attended Baxter Seminary High School and later received his degree in animal science from the University of Tennessee. After serving two years in the United States Army, Silas came home with a renewed desire to make a change.

Wanting to start something new is the reason Silas chose Charolais back in 1970.

"I wanted something different, Silas said. "There weren't many in the area, and I wanted that to change."

This desire for change is what propelled him to leave his mark on the breed a big way. Silas' bull, Tennessee Cherokee 108, set performance marks within the breed including the highest weaning weight and yearling weight at the time. He went on to raise many respected dams as well as a string of show cattle that competed all across the country.

In addition to leaving his mark on the genetic potential of the breed, Silas has also left his mark on the boards and committees serving the cattle industry in Tennessee. This included service in many leadership positions like his position as the area director of the AICA for the state of Tennessee and the AICA Executive Committee. Silas served on the AICA Junior Council for many years, being Chairman for 3 years. He was also the charter member of the Tennessee Charolais Association. One of his proudest accomplishments was his role as the founder of the Appalachian Classic Charolais Sale, which still takes place today.

Silas has dedicated much of his time to the Charolais industry both in and out of the show ring. Alongside his late wife Jewell Maxwell, his children Scott and Annette showed cattle while they were growing up and this enthusiasm has since been passed on to his grandchildren.

Outside of his family, Silas also had other individuals that showed for him throughout the years, and he shared remarkable stories about their experiences including stories about the residents of a local children's home.

This home was established for children who came from disadvantaged families and after speaking with the director of the facility, Silas decided that he wanted to help

provide a meaningful activity for the children and shed a positive light in their otherwise tough lives. He invited them to show his cattle and they were kept at the barn of the children's home.

He specifically remembers one little girl he worked with who tried to run away from the children's home. The directors looked and looked and eventually found her in the barn nestled up with her calf. The girl explained that she went to her calf because it was the only thing in her life that "understood her and knew her."

The success these children found in the show ring often carried over into their daily lives even years after they grew up and moved on. He encountered another showman he had worked with from the facility at the local grocery store one day where she was working. After catching up about her old show times, she said that she had saved up the money she earned from showing and was using it to help go to college in the fall.

One of Silas' most remarkable stories about showing cattle he found closer to home. His second wife Arleen is the grandmother of two adopted children, one of which has autism. This little girl also loved the show ring and when they went to the fair, she never wanted to leave! Seeing the improvements, he could help make to people's lives and doing it through the Charolais cattle he loves is what keeps him in the industry.

Even though many of his showman have grown up and moved on, he continues to make an impact with FFA members like Gracie Weiberg who is currently serving as one of the AIJCA board members. Gracie got her start into the Charolais breed by working with Silas through her local Daniel Boone FFA and is one of several Daniel Boone FFA members attending the Junior National in Georgia this summer. Silas also supports members from the Chuckey Doak FFA Chapter.

Youth and the use of livestock to teach the important life lessons is a part of who Silas is and is something that he values. He enjoys having young children in the show barn because it teaches them important things they need to know for the rest of their lives. Showing teaches kids how to work diligently, how to take responsibility, and most importantly that hard work pays off. When kids show, they have incentive to do big things in their lives and it makes them set goals for themselves for anything else they want to do in the future.

Silas is a great asset to the cattle industry and the Charolais breed is lucky to have him. The way Silas sees it, he is lucky to be a part of the industry too.

"I love it. It is in me and it is what I want to do. I enjoy the people and it is wonderful to see what the breed can do."
