





The Squeaky Wheel

Share our Story

We all know the meaning of the old adage, “The squeaky wheel gets the grease.” Reading the news each day brings that old saying to mind. It seems everyday we are faced with national headlines designed to shock and sway. Add the warp speed of the Internet and social media, and the proverbial squeaky wheel quickly turns into a full-blown, wheels falling off train wreck in less than 24 hours!

Food animal production is all too often the target. Big versus little, antibiotics, greenhouse gasses, beta-agonists, meat processing, confined feeding, natural and organic versus conventional, and animal rights—it’s an overwhelming list of extremists and loud critics lined up to assault every segment of beef production everyday. These people, totally disconnected from the reality of how their food gets to their local supermarket, have no idea of the consequences if they are successful.

For the majority of critics, the truth isn’t nearly as sensational as the

story about the health and care of your cattle, the stewardship of your land and the importance of the end product that supplies the world with safe, nutritious beef.” Unfortunately, for as good and truthful as the story is, we take it for granted. We take for granted that someone who’s never set foot in a snow drift looking for a lost animal or saw the birth of a newborn calf will care how many generations have preceded you.

We take for granted science and common sense will prevail. Today, however, there is a chasm as deep and wide as the Grand Canyon between the consumer’s perception of our industry and the reality. Our critics are incredibly skillful at using social media to apply social pressure and, ultimately, terrible legislation, whether it’s necessary, feasible, based in fact or fiction.

We must remember we are a dwindling minority that bears the heavy responsibility of producing meat animal protein to feed a growing planet.

overly hyped, unsupported rhetoric. John F. Kennedy once said, “The great enemy of the truth is very often not the lie—deliberate, contrived and dishonest—but the myth—persistent, persuasive and unrealistic.”

Legitimate journalists have enormous respect for balanced news and have been “conditioned” throughout the years by observant and demanding editors to respect the profession and report, not proselytize. If it isn’t objective, factual reporting, it’s an opinion. In fact, respected journalists reporting the news have been at the very bedrock of our democracy for more than two centuries.

The take home message is we all have a vested interest in being ever vigilant. Our industry critics are relentless, loud and committed. They raise money, understand how to get national attention and adore seeing their cause splashed across the evening news. Learning how to respond, at whatever level we can have the most impact, is more than important—it’s vital.

Membership in the AICA is obtainable when the applicant has ownership in at least one animal, and has paid the initial membership fee of \$125. AICA annual dues are \$100.



The New Year is quickly approaching and there are several things AICA members need to remember. 2014 dues are due January 1st 2014, active member dues are \$100, junior member dues are \$25. Dues reminder notices were mailed out in November. Don't let your membership lapse, you'll miss your Charolais Journal and may be charged non-member fees.

Watch your mail for the 2014 female enrollment forms. January through March is the time to dispose of females you no longer have and enroll your active cows. The fee to enroll females in the WHR (Whole Herd Reward) program is \$14 until April 1st. There is no fee to enroll in the PPR (Performance Plus Program), you pay the traditional registration and transfer fees depending on the age of the calves. On-line enrollment will be open in January; many members find this a convenient way to complete the enrollment process quickly.

The year letter for 2014 is "B."

Reminders:

- All transfer paperwork must include a date of sale. Transfers of ownership cannot be processed without a date of sale.
- AICA recognizes 1/2, 1/3, 1/4 and 1/8th interests. Animals cannot be transferred into any other percentages than the ones listed. If more than 8 people own an interest in the animal, you will need to create a syndicate or combination number showing more than one person.
- Females being sold bred must have the breeding listed on the back of the paper, including all A.I. breeding. Bulls you do not own require signatures.
- Transfer paperwork must be sent to the office within 30 days of the date of sale (PPR and Registration Only members) and within 60 days for WHR members. Penalty fees apply if the paper work arrives at the office outside the 30-60 days. If you hold the paperwork longer than 60 days, plan on paying penalties. WHR members: the late transfer date penalty is \$5 a month after 60 days.

Weather

woes slow down cattle industry expansion

Drought, flooding and blizzard—Mother Nature has really put some pressure on the cattle industry over the past few years. Cattleman, Jan Severance says they have seen it all over the past few years on his north central North Dakota ranch.

“We went from dry to quite wet in a year or two and from a lack of feed supply to an abundant feed supply,” he says.

In 2011 and 2012, the drought opened up Conservation Reserve Program acres for haying and grazing. The cattlemen in North Dakota needed the hay in 2011, but in 2012, most of the hay was sent to other states that were suffering from extreme drought.

Early in 2012, North Dakota received a large amount of rain, which made the grass grow quickly. From July until October 2012, they received little or no rain, but the early moisture helped hold them over for the remainder of the year.

“The problem we are facing now is the age of the cattle producers. With better times in the future, most cattle producers in this area are middle-aged or older,” says Severance. “The younger people haven’t been coming back until we saw more profits. Even with the number of people returning to the farms and ranches now, we could see problems in the future with who will be raising our cattle.”

Severance and his family have about 300 cows—200 Charolais and 100 Angus. They have raised Charolais cattle in North Dakota for 39 years, and have also raised Angus cattle for the past 10 years. With the current abundant feed supply, he says herds are starting to expand again.

“In 2011, during the drought, we cut back on cows. On our ranch, cows weren’t given a second chance if they were open or had other problems. We had to trim the edges to be able to get by. Cows with calves were the ones who could stay and we had to provide them with the best possible opportunity to raise that calf,” he says.

Now, however, with better weather conditions and a more abundant feed supply, he thinks there will be an increase in herds in the area. Many are keeping more replacement heifers and the demand for high quality females

is great, along with a strong bull market. Oklahoma State University livestock economist Darrell Peel says historically the cattle cycle has been self-regulating and driven by factors such as calf price levels, beef biology and the rigidity of forage resources used in the industry, but in the past several years it has been affected more by the drought, markets shocks, reduced profitability and global economies.

“This means that the last 3.4 million head decline in the beef cow herd was not due to typical cattle cycle factors,” says Peel. While the drought is the current factor affecting the cattle cycle, Peel expects the normal factors to become relevant in the future.

“In situations where drought has forced inventory adjustments that are counter to what producers want to do, the details of how the adjustments happen become important,” says Peel.

Since the peak of the total cattle inventory in January 1995, there has been a steady decrease. The January 2013 cattle inventory was the lowest since 1952, and Peel expects the inventory to be lower yet in January 2014.

“Factors such as drought and feed costs have had a tremendous effect on the cattle industry. Beef producers have been ready to expand again, but haven’t been able to,” he says.

Drought has been the limiting factor on the cattle industry for the past two years. At the end of 2012, more than 50 percent of the pastures were in poor condition all across the country. Moisture has improved over part of the country, but others are still suffering.

The Livestock and Marketing Information Center says 1.9 percent more heifers will be kept as beef replacements in 2013 and fewer cows will be culled this year. If this is true, this could be the start of a rebuilding period for the U.S. cowherd.

For the year to date, heifer slaughter is down nearly 7 percent from the average heifer slaughter during 2009-2011. Peel expects heifer slaughter could drop another 7 percent to 8 percent in 2014, with accelerated heifer retention.

While rebuilding may not be happening as quickly in the southern states because of the extensive drought, Severance thinks there will be a good rebuilding of herds in North Dakota and in South Dakota after their October blizzard.

Peel says most herd expansions include one to two years of minimal or modest growth before accelerating for two to three years. A growth is expected in the next couple years and then a level off of the number of heifers held for replacements.

He says the good news is that the current U.S. cowherd is as young and productive as ever, which means the expansion could be more rapid.

“By 2017, I would expect we could have numbers back close to about the same level as we had in 2011,”

says Peel. “With the 2013 calf crop being the smallest since 1942, we should expect those numbers to start increasing by 2015.”

Severance says the challenges will continue for cattle producers, with weather and input costs bringing the most concern.

“The higher corn prices made many farmers, even in North Dakota, take land out of CRP and put it into crop production. Land that has poor soil and in the past wouldn’t have worked for crop production, but with new technology, they have been able to manage it,” he says.

These farmers were rewarded with profits, but he says they also need to realize that management of the land is key when it comes to making it productive, whether it is in grain production or grass production. In 2013, North Dakota had an abundance of moisture, and if they experience a higher than normal amount of snowfall this winter, flooding could be a problem again.

“Farming and ranching is always about being prepared for whatever Mother Nature throws at you,” says Severance.

In the past few years, cattle producers have seen it all.
